

DOXOLOGY

The word doxology is made of two Greek words: doxa and logos. Doxa means glory and logos means word. Doxology thus means a word of glory. Doxology for the Christian means saying words of glory to God or about God. For those saved by the blood of Christ we can praise God for his great salvation. Those born again can praise God for his wonderful grace to us. Those who believe on the Lord Jesus Christ can praise God for his merciful forgiveness of all our sins (Col. 2:13). We can praise him for who he is and for all of his mighty works. David said it this way: Now therefore, our God, we thank thee, **and praise thy glorious name.**" (1 Chronicles 29:13) In the Psalms it says: **"And blessed be his glorious name for ever:"** (Psalms 72:19)

Giving God glory means to deem him worthy of our highest respect and reverence. Do we consider the God of the Bible most high and lofty?

Thomas Ken wrote the Doxology. This short yet majestic hymn is known as "Praise God, from Whom All blessings Flow."
